# Ordinance 2022-15 Fixing of the Salaries for Budget Year 2023

Sandra Hash, Clerk Treasurer explained these reflect the budget and includes the \$10,000.00 raises. She has them listed by the bi-weekly salaries in case of a 27 pay year they are still covered as opposed to listing by annual salary per the recommendation of State Board of Accounts. It can become sticky on those years listing it as annual. There were no changes to the Parks Board, Plan Commission or Board of Zoning Appeals. Sandra Hash suggested supervisors look over the list and report any necessary changes to her.

### **Envision Ellettsville**

**Dan Rarey** stated the advisory board has been formed with 5 members so far and possibly 6 soon. They have 6 task forces formed and have a lot of volunteers. He mentioned getting in

touch with Kyle Hannon if anyone would like to serve on any of the task forces. The task forces are Business, Gathering, Connectivity, Housing, Beautification and Branding. The directors of the advisory board are Dr. Jerry Sanders, Christa Curtis, Leasa Siscoe, Donna Niese and Dan Rarey. The comprehensive plan meeting will be held on December 12<sup>th</sup>, the Unified Development Ordinance will begin in February/March, the board drafted a letter of support for Ellettsville's ready grant application and that has been submitted.

# 2023 Agreement between the Town of Ellettsville and Richland Township Trustee for Mowing Services

**Kip Headdy**, Street Commissioner explained he met with Marty Stephens a few weeks ago to discuss the current agreement they have to mow the ballfields and Marci Jane Lewis Park. He requested to raise it due to the economy. The current agreement is for \$3,000.00 yearly and Marty suggested \$6,400.00 yearly and including mowing around his office building. Trevor Sager made a motion to approve the 2023 Agreement between the Town of Ellettsville and Richland Township Trustee for Mowing Services. Pamela Samples seconded. # 2023 Agreement between the Town of Ellettsville and Monroe County Public Library to provide Community Access Television for Council Meetings

Sandra Hash, Clerk Treasurer explained this is a standard agreement every year. There is a minimal increase of around \$300.00. We receive proceeds from Comcast from everyone who subscribes to Comcast TV in the amount of 5% known as cable franchise fees. These fees pay for the cost of CATS TV. The amount has decreased as a result of streaming but still more than enough to pay the entire cost. Dan Swafford made a motion to approve 2023 Agreement between the Town of Ellettsville and Monroe County Public Library to provide Community Access Television services. Trevor Sager seconded. ### Street Department Quotes for a Sand Spreader for a Pickup Truck

**Kip Headdy**, Street Commissioner explained that he would like to purchase this to add to a pick-up they already have. This will allow the current truck to plow and sand instead of calling for a spreader after plowing. The last several years they have acquired more mileage from the county and Town parking lots. It also adds a counterweight to the vehicle to balance out the weight from the plow. He has sufficient funds in the budget to cover this expense. He further explained that the quotes from Clark Truck Equipment and TEBCO in the amount of \$6,400.00 are the actual cost for the specified Eastern Tornado 78000-1 Sand Spreader and the Meyer Truck Equipment quote of \$7,062.00 was not able to cover his specifications. Dan Swafford made a motion to accept the bid from Clark Truck Equipment in the amount of \$6,400.00 for the sand spreader. Trevor Sager seconded. Denise Line, Planner mentioned being awarded a \$10,575.00 from the Smithville Community Foundation to purchase shade sails for the new playgrounds. It includes the posts, fixtures and sails and will be ordered from a company in South Carolina who makes them. Mike Farmer is still working on getting the rubber mulch in the playgrounds, crews have been especially busy but are working on getting things done.

Sandra Hash, Clerk Treasurer discussed on November 9th the employees met for the annual insurance renewal meeting. Health, Dental and Vision insurance had a 0% increase for next year. She thanked JA Benefits for helping them with keeping it the same.
